The Real Miracle By Dr. Ryan Wilson

Easter is something bigger and grander than our words can capture. Each Gospel writer told the story in a pretty simple and straight forward way, but each had a little different perspective on what happened and what was significant. Clearly, the resurrection was the focal point of Jesus' life and ministry; so I'm surprised that they didn't say more.

Sometimes, I guess, the simplicity and truth of something conveys more than words can say. The power of the resurrection reminds us that God can bring life from the bleakest of circumstances. Words will not ever capture the magnitude of the event.

Former pastor, John Claypool, once said that the real miracle of Easter was "not just that the dead came back to life, but that God sent his His Son back to the same people who killed him." When you think about it that way, it is pretty amazing that God raised Jesus from the dead and gave him back to us in spite of us killing him and in spite of our sin.

This Easter, give thanks to God for the hope that comes in Easter. No matter how bleak things can look and no matter how dark death's sting can feel, Easter declares that there is always hope. Even though we may reject and kill Jesus, God declares through the resurrection that I still love you and Jesus' way will ultimately bring life!
